

Have you seen God this Summer? He's everywhere and nowhere, in the unexpected and the mundane. He is in the lost and lonely, in the fleeting moment and the endless night. We just have to look for Him and there He will be.

Last Summer I went with a Cross of Glory team to Centro Infantil de los Angeles daycare (formerly known as Casa) and did not realize He was there until a few weeks after I returned. I was on the receiving end of a nasty comment about Mexico, and I looked back at my week searching for the good I knew was there. I found the good, and bonus I found God.

We are called to love our neighbors and in my opinion those near and far. We are called to help those in need. What we do for one does not depend on their distance from us. Love. Help. Extend a hand. Show by example. Love thy neighbor and boy did we ever!!

The unique thing is that God was at work at that daycare all day every day. His hands mopped and changed diapers and fed babies and wiped away tears. He is still there and will be there long after we've left. There is a huge chain of love running from mom to mom to kid to kid to teacher to teacher. The chain, I realized, stretched from here to there, and our group was a link in that chain. Through our church we are still a link.

We are called to serve and love and to help. If we look we can find God with us as we do what he asks of us. We can also find God during the day to day routine of our lives. Think about the last few months and where you have seen Him and look for Him as we finish out the season. I saw God, for example, when Pastor Dana announced that the VBS kids had collected \$1500.00 for Fairmount School. He was with the children and their families as they donated.

When I actively search for Him during my day, I find humor instead of aggravation. I find patience and strength and a calmness. I appreciate my job and know I am lucky to love what I do for a living. Seeking Him brings a lightness to the day.

Have you seen God this Summer? I'm willing to bet you already have!
